#### Daniela Conti (IT)

Head of <u>UISP Policy for Interculturality and Cooperation</u> and coordinator of the SENTRY Sport project.

Since 1996, she has been working in UISP in different sectors: projecting department, social policies, international relationship. UISP has participated or coordinated more than 50 projects on anti-discrimination in sport: training sport managers/coaches, projects in school and sport clubs, promoting awareness campaigns and antiracist sport events.

She holds a degree in Sociology of organisation and sport.

## Catherine Moyon de Baecque (FR)

President, Commission to combat sexual violence and discrimination in sport (CNOSF), Ambassador for Values of Olympism in France.

The first high-level athlete to break silence in sport by courageously denouncing the acts of which she had been a victim when she was sexually assaulted by the French national athletics team during a training session in the summer of 1991. She has led a historic fight, alone against all odds, for 20 years, which opened the way to many other battles. In January 2023, she was conferred the National Order of the Legion of Honour, with the rank of Knight.



## Carla Napolano (FR/IT)

Deputy Director at the European Forum for Urban Security (<u>Efus</u>) and partner of the SENTRY Sport project.

She is responsible for network development and relations with Efus members and network development. She also supervises the running of thematic European programmes, partners and European authorities. Carla began her career in the UN Safer Cities programme (UN Habitat) in Nairobi, Kenya.



Gabriela uses her expertise in pursuing public policy reforms to increase inclusion, diversity and respect in human rights to combat hate speech in sport and show that respect can be multiplied in our society - in sport and through sport. Her objective is to make a difference, a sustainable societal change through #Sport IS Respect.

The project aims to combat hate speech in sport by providing technical assistance to public authorities in member states and other sport stakeholders to develop comprehensive strategies within a human rights framework.

Coordinator, fairplay prevention, Vienna Institute for International Dialogue and Cooperation (VIDC), partner of the SENTRY Sport project

He also organises events, training sessions and workshops, and awareness-raising campaigns against misanthropical ideologies. Previously, he was the festival director of the International Human Rights Film Festival for four years.

He holds a Master's degree in International Development at the University of Vienna.



#### **Kurt Wachter (AT)**

Head of VIDC fairplay with a focus on EU application coordination, sport & development and social inclusion through sport.

He founded the fairplay initiative at the VIDC in 1997 and coordinated the Football Against Racism in Europe (FARE) network. He has led several EU projects, including Queering Football, Sport Welcomes Refugees, SPIN Women and SPIN Refugees.

He studied Ethnology and African Studies at the University of Vienna and University of Cape Coast (Ghana). Completion of a master's degree in "Sport and Development" at Southampton Solent University.



#### Alpha Camara (FR)

Coach U18/ Senior, Championnet Sports, Paris

Alpha began his football journey at age 8, showcasing early promise with his local club in Paris before being scouted by a Scottish club in 2017. His remarkable stint in Scotland was followed by a move to England with Walton Casual, but after six months, he returned to France to pursue coaching. Using his experience and the BPJESP qualification, Alpha rose through the ranks at Championnet Sport, overseeing multiple teams and serving as the football department coordinator, making a significant impact on local football development.



## Saidou Oumar Daffe (IT/SN)

Footballer, Head of Anti-Discrimination Office & CSR Senior Specialist in <u>Lega Serie A</u> for the coordination in particular of projects to raise awareness and combat all forms of discrimination.

President-Founder of the Social Promotion Association <u>'Calcio Dilettanti e Solidarietà APS</u>', since 2014, with the aim of creating a bridge of social and cultural relations between Italy and Senegal through football.



# Valentina Petrillo (IT/TUR)

Italian Paralympic athlete competing in the 100, 200 and 400 m T12 class visually impaired sprint.

She is the first trans woman to take part in an international Paralympic Women's Championship, debuting at the Italian Paralympic Athletics Championships. She is the main character of <u>5 Nanomoli</u>, a film about transgender people's participation in sports.



# Hilal Erkoca (DK/TUR)

Hilal has been working as project coordinator in <u>International Sport and Culture Association</u> (ISCA) for 4 years. She studied Political Science at the Galatasaray University in Istanbul, and holds a Master's degree in European Politics from the Science Po de Rennes, France. Before moving to Denmark, she worked with the Galatasaray Football Club as sports event coordinator for 2 years in Istanbul, and worked as Erasmus Specialist at the Altinbas University in Istanbul, Turkey.
